A degree College at Manikpur was a crying need of the people of Manikpur locality comprising of the entire Manikpur Police Station, some parts of Sorbhog Thana lying west of the river Bhulukadoba (Pokalagi) and considerable portion of the Abhayapuri Thana adjacent to Manikpur with a population not less than one lakh. Consequently, a degree college in the name and style of "Manikpur Anchalik College" was opened on the 2nd August, 1993 to cater to the needs of the people of this educationally and economically backward area. TDC 1st year classes were running on regularly and smoothly in a semi-permanent building owned by Govinda Bhavan Geeta Satra, Manikpur, for the time being, under the able supervision of a competent principal and duly qualified six lecturers including necessary office bearer. The Government of Assam was pleased to allot plot of land measuring 40 Bighas already from the Barbila V.G.R. for the college.The college was shifted from Govinda Bhavan Geeta Satra to the newly constructed building at Barbila on 2nd Aug., 1995. Late Ashwini Kr.Talukdar, retired Vice-Principal of Barnagar College, Sorbhog, was the Founder Principal and the then D.C., Bongaigaon, was the first President of the Governing Body of the College.

Now, Manikpur Anchalik College, Manikpur is the only institution of higher education in greater Manikpur area. Establishing a college in an area like Manikpur which is predominately inhabited by people belonging to economically and educationally backward classes, was a herculean effort on the part of our founding fathers. The College has been imparting education to a large number of students hailing from different interior village which are both economically and socially backward. The number of student is gradually increasing and it shows the growing popularity of the college. At present the college has more than two thousand students who are pursuing B.A. courses. With about forty teaching staff and fifteen non-teaching staff, the college is running on smoothly and fruitfully towards its desired goal. It functions like a family where teachers, students and non-teaching fraternity work hand in order to create a healthy academic environment. The college has also adopted recently NEP framework under affiliation of Gauhati University. The college has been recently accredited with grade 'B' by UGC NAAC.





Vision

Manikpur Anchalik College was established with the vision of promoting quality education in the surrounding rural areas. The College aims at creating an optimal and enriching learning environment for students to pursue their academic and sporting dreams. 
Mission

Admission Procedure

The applicants have to register themselves through the Samarth admission portal. After the completion of registration process, the applicants have to apply online to Samarth portal for admission into the B.A. programme in Manikpur Anchalik College under FYUGP of Gauhati University.

Eligibility Criteria

Candidates intending to get admission in B.A. are required to pass H.S. or equivalent recognized examination.

Candidates for admission are selected strictly on merit basis only. The college authority reserves the right to reject an application for admission if any discripences are found in their application.

Admission Requirement

Candidates are required to produce the following documents at the time of admission:

- a) Marksheet of the last qualififying examination.
- b) H.S.L.C. Admit card or Certificate as proof of age.
- c) Character Certificate / Testimonial certificate.
- b) Cast Certificate (for OBC, MOBC, SC, ST & EWS) only.
- e) Gap certificate (if necessary)
- f) Migration Certificate (if necessary)
- g) Passport size photo (two copies)
- h) Income Certificate from cocerned authority (For Students seeking Free Admission in B.A. Coursre)

Intake of Boys' Hostel

There is a boys' hostel in the college campus and it has 40 intake capacities. After the admission into the college the interested students can apply for the same.

An Outline of FYUGP of Gauhati University as per the Model of NEP, 2020-

1. Introduction

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular Framework, published in November 2022. The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). Though, the FYUGP is basically a CBCS, it

is radically different from the courses running under CBCS. Namely, it does not differentiate between so-called Honours and Pass courses existing under CBCS. Basically, the FYUGP is

based on the system of education under Liberal Arts.

1.1 Salient features

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor's Degree programme under the CBCS is a 3-year degree

programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science, or Commerce. One can also have a Bachelor's of Vocation degree, being run in some colleges, which in short form known as the BVoc degree. The two systems – Bachelor's

Course under CBCS and Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP of NEP are different in the following ways.

Duration

While under CBCS, one has a 3-year degree programme, under the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme.

Exits & Entries

Under CBCS, one needs to complete the full 3-year programme in order to get a degree. There is no provision for dropping out of the programme in the middle. While in the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

Key Points- If you exit in the middle, the doors are still open for you to enter into the programme again and you can start the journey from where you left.

No such provisions exists in the CBCS.

Honours and Major

Under the CBCS, we either have Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a regular Bachelor's Degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree 7

Introduction

with Major & Honours after 4 year.

Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the



first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree. Under CBCS, there was no such pathways.

Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral

programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.

1.2 How different are the courses?

The major differentiator between the FYUGP and the existing CBCS is the student's ability

to study different subjects of choice and also the ability to switch between subjects. Basically,

there are two parts of a course under the FYUGP – (a) Core Courses and (b) Common 8

Introduction

Courses. As the name suggests, different students study different core courses and all students

study the common courses. Below, we describe what you will study in different parts of the programme.

First Year (Semester I & II)

In the first year, one studies three different core subjects – one paper of each subjects per semester. Besides, one needs to study a host of common subjects that we have designed as per UGC's Curricular Framework. Details of these courses are described in this booklet.

Second Year (Semester III & IV)

- Semester III

In the third semester, one will usually continue with the same core subjects that have already been chosen in the first year and again study some common subjects. In the third semester, one will also take a step forward to study the favourite subject by declaring one of the core subjects as a Major subject and other two as Minors. However, the structure of the programme Key Points- If you would like to change a Minor subjects in the third semester, you can change with the following limitations: 1. You will be able to change a subject, provided the new subject can accommodate you. This can be a problem with science subjects as they need to ensure laboratory space for each student. 2. Besides, as you have already abandoned the first year time studying a subject which you no longer want to continue,



remains same as in first & second semesters.

From Semester IV onwards, one will primarily study the Major subject by taking at least four papers, some of which may be elective depending on the subject concerned.

As the programme structure in the third semester is you will need to use your same as the first & second semesters, one will have the option of changing the Major in fourth semester to any one of the other two Minors as well, even if one has already declared a Major in the third semester. However this has the condition that the new Major subject of choice has vacancy.

Key Points contd. free credits to compensate for the new subject. This will be more clear once you see the examples we have given afterwards.

Third Year

In the third year, one will continue to study the Major subject to complete a full set of 15 papers in Majors.

Fourth Year

If one intends to progress to the fourth year, s/he will be devoting the time in studying advanced courses which will be at the level of initial Master's degree papers. Besides, one will also have the opportunity of engaging into research work with the faculty

Besides the above, there are some more unique features of the FYUGP. They are **Free Credits**

From third to sixth semesters, one will have time for 4 free credits per semester, which 9

Introduction

one can utilise for having more Minors. They can also come handy, if one had changed a Minor subject in between.

Double Major

If a student is ready to do some more hard work, s/he can take some extra online courses (from designated sources only) related to the Minors and can then convert one of the Minors to a second Major by the time one completes 3 / 4 years of study. This is over and above the first Major. In this case, one will have a Bachelor's Degree with Double Majors.
